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To be eligible for the Child Life certification exam, students must complete a 3-credit hour (120 clock hours) Child Life Practicum and a 12- credit hour (600 clock hours) Child Life Internship. Placements are dependent on formal acceptance into a hospital-based Child Life practicum/internship program, and are not guaranteed by the University. By utilizing both FCS electives and free electives, students will have the opportunity to complete the requirements necessary for exam eligibility within the 120 hour degree plan.

Southeastern 101 is not required of transfer or readmitted students with 30 hours or more. Those students must replace SE 101 with 2 hours of electives.
