## Southeastern Louisiana University RN to BSN Curriculum

\*The following <u>PREREQUISITE</u> courses may be substituted (Block Credit) with other courses of equivalent credit hours: CHEM 107, NUTR 251, BIOL 152, LS 102, Math 161, MICL 224, ZOOL 252, ZOOL 253, and SE 101. The substituted courses do not need to be the same class, nor do they need to be in the same discipline.

Example 1: You may be allowed to substitute a non-nutrition course for NUTR 251. Example 2: You may be allowed to substitute a non-math course for MATH 161.

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#### **Prerequisites:**

The 59 credit hours of **<u>PREREQUISITES</u>** can be taken at Southeastern or transferred from another accredited U.S. institution. Final approval of coursework is conducted by the Office of the Registrar.

This means that the RN to BSN student may receive credit for previous coursework taken at another accredited U.S. institution, and it can be transferred to meet the **<u>PREREQUISITE</u>** requirements at Southeastern.

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## <sup>†</sup>NURSING BLOCK CREDIT

<u>Block Credit</u> - A transfer of credit hours in which a predetermined number of transfer credits are permitted to be used in the program. Block Credit facilitates the transfer of credit at the program level rather that at the specific course level; the credit is recognized as having an academic wholeness and satisfies a part of the BSN requirements.

Thirty (30) credit hours by Block Credit may be awarded for your <u>previous</u> nursing courses and may be used in the RN to BSN Program towards the required 120 hours.

To be awarded Block Credit, the RN must meet one of the following two items:

- 1.) An Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) from a U.S. institution that is both regionally accredited and accredited by ACEN (formerly NLNAC) OR NLN CNEA, with a GPA of 2.5 or higher in all coursework related to the ADN and any non-nursing courses that transfer into the Program.
- 2.) Completion of a diploma program in nursing which is accredited by ACEN (formerly NLNAC) OR NLN CNEA from a regionally accredited U.S. institution.

Note: Individuals with an ADN or diploma from institutions that are <u>not</u> ACEN or CNEA accredited are <u>not</u> eligible for enrollment in the RN to BSN Program.

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### Additional Facts:

- The <u>59 hours</u> of **PREREQUISITES** and the <u>30 hours</u> of **Nursing Block Credit** must be completed/transferred and approved by the Office of the Registrar before the student is permitted to enroll in any RN to BSN nursing course. After the 89 hours (59 + 30) are completed, the student will begin the RN to BSN Nursing Core courses.
- The RN must have a 2.5 GPA or higher to be accepted into the RN to BSN Program. Once accepted, the student must maintain a degree GPA of 2.5 or better, a GPA of 2.3 or better in the major, and achieve a "C" or better in each required nursing course to meet graduation requirements.
- To earn the BSN at Southeastern, the RN must attain one of the following criteria:
  - 1.) The student must complete all 31 credit hours of Nursing Core courses at Southeastern. -OR-
  - 2.) The student must earn 30 of the 120 credit hours at Southeastern.
