Export Control Attestation

Background

There is a new federal requirement that employers certify that they have reviewed the **Export Administration Regulations (EAR)** and the **International Traffic in Arms (ITAR)** and have determined whether a license is required from the U.S. Department of Commerce or the U.S. Department of State to allow an employee access to controlled technology. Technology and technical data provided to a foreign national within the U.S. is considered an *export*. **This attestation is REQUIRED for all H-1B petitions and O-1 petitions.** Information on export controls can be found on the Intellectual Property web page at <http://www.selu.edu/admin/osrp/research/toolbox/index.html>

The hiring supervisor, principal investigator, Department Head, or other appropriate University authority responsible for oversight of an employee's work and access to technology, must attest to one of the following two statements in order for the ISO to process the H-1B or O-1 petition.

Please understand that a license may be required. Questions should be directed to the Office of Sponsored Research and Programs after a thorough review of information published on the website.
