## Athletics at Southeastern Louisiana University Notable Highlights 2014 - 2015



- » The Southeastern Louisiana football team repeated as Southland Conference champions and advanced to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoffs for the second straight season. The Lions finished 9-4 overall and 7-1 in Southland Conference play, finishing the season ranked No. 12 in the final FCS Coaches poll and No. 14 in the final Sports Network poll.
- » The Southeastern Louisiana baseball team won the first Southland Conference regular season championship in school history. The Lions set a school record for wins, finishing 42-17 overall. SLU's 25-5 conference record also set a new singleseason Southland Conference record for conference wins.
- » Three members of the Southeastern track and field program advanced to the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, OR. Junior Alex Young, senior Jonathan Kinchen and junior Misha Frazier earned All-America honors after competing in the hammer competition at the NCAA out door meet.
- » The Southeastern golf team advanced to the NCAA Regionals for the fifth time in the past six years. The Lions also had a school-record four players-- senior Grady Brame, seniour Baptiste Courtachon, junior Eamon Bradley and junior Lawrence Allen - on the Cleveland Golf/Srixon All-America Scholar list.

- » The Southeastern softball team advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament, finishing fourth in the final league standings. Junior Katie Lacour was named to the All-Region team after finishing fifth in the nation with a .484 batting average.
- » In its first season under head coach Jay Ladner, the Southeastern men's basketball team advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament.
- The Southeastern Louisiana tennis team advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament. Junior Renee Villarreal was named first team All-Southland and All-Louisiana for the third straight season after finishing 17-3 overall at No. 1 singles. The 4.0 student was also named first team Academic All-Southland Conference and CoSIDA Academic All-District VI for the second straight season.
- » The Southeastern soccer team finished 12-8 overall and advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament. Sophomores Bri Singh (13 goals) and Katie Noonan (10 assists) were the league's leading scorers.
- » The Lady Lion volleyball team advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament for the first time under head coach Jim Smoot.
- » Junior forward Nanna Pool represented the Southeatern women's basketball team on the All-Southland conference team.
