2016 - 2017 Highlights

- Honors courses were taught in many areas in 2016-17 including: Art, English, History, Humanities, Psychology, Rhetoric, and Science and enrollment in those classes was 9.9% higher in 2016-17 (n=367) than in 2015-16 (n=334).
- » Fall 2017 enrollment in Honors sections (n=422) nearly doubled fall 216 enrollment (n=217) with a 95% increase over the previous fall.

- » Twelve seniors presented their theses and earned the Honors or Scholars Diploma in 2016-17. The disciplines in which the theses were completed attest to the breadth of the Honors Program: Art, Biology, Communication, Computer Science, Family and Consumer Sciences, History, Kinesiology and Health Studies, Music, Teaching and Learning, and Theater were each represented.
- Honors Graduates in 2016-17 were admitted to a number of graduate and professional schools including students on scholarship to Louisiana State University's Manship School and Masters of Public Policy program and the University of Southern Mississippi's graduate program in History. Students were also admitted to medical school at Louisiana State University's Health Sciences Center in Shreveport.
