## 2017 - 2018 Highlights

- » The Honors Program at Southeastern offers curricular and co-curricular opportunities that help students to know and understand the significant ideas and events that have shaped our world and will shape the future; to have confidence in their ability to think independently, write clearly, and speak effectively; and to develop the skills to be leaders in their communities and professions.
- » Honors students were attracted to the program from every academic department on campus.

- Honors courses were taught in many areas in 2017-18 including: Art, English, History, Humanities, Psychology, Rhetoric, and Science.
- » Enrollment in Fall and Spring Honors classes was 102% higher in 2017-18 (n=741) than in 2016-17 (n=367).
- » Fall 2018 enrollment in Honors sections (n=614) was 46% higher than Fall 2017 enrollment (n=422).
- » Twelve seniors presented their theses and earned the Honors or Scholars Diploma in 2017-18. The disciplines in which the theses were completed attest to the breadth of the Honors Program: Biology, English, General Studies, Information Technology, Kinesiology, Psychology, and Teaching and Learning were represented.
- » Honors Graduates in 2017-18 were admitted to a number of graduate and professional schools including students on scholarship to Southeastern's graduate programs in English and Counseling and one admitted to Louisiana State University's School of Medicine in New Orleans.
