

#### **Longitudinal Enrollment**

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 1.3% from the Fall 2016 semester to the Fall 2017 semester. This reflects a 1.6% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 3.0% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



### **Minority Enrollment**

The enrollment of minority students increased to 32.5% of total enrollment compared to 31.2% in Fall 2016.

#### **Average Course Loads**

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.6 hours which is an increase from 11.4 in Fall 2016. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 6.9 hours, which is a decrease from 7.1 in Fall 2016.

#### **Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores**

The average ACT Composite score increase from 22.3 in Fall 2016 to 22.5 in Fall 2017.

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 0.4% from the Fall 2016 semester to the Fall 2017 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

### **Top Six Parishes**



Ascension Parish had the largest percent increase in graduate students with an increase of 11.1%.
