

Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment increased by 1.0% from the Spring 2017 semester to the Spring 2018 semester. This reflects a increase of 1.0% in undergraduate enrollment and a 1.6% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 31.2% of total enrollment compared to 29.8% in Spring 2017.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.0 hours which is a slight increase from 10.9 in Spring 2017. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.0 hours, which is a slight increase from 6.9 in Spring 2017.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased slightly from 21.6 in Spring 2017 to 21.5 in Spring 2018.

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught increased 2.2% from the Spring 2017 semester to the Spring 2018 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 12, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 9.

Top Six Parishes


