Graduate Professional Education

Three (37.5%) of the respondents plan on enrolling in a second Master's degree program in the future and five (62.5%) have no plans for further education.

Employment

All (100.0%) of the respondents are currently employed full-time. Most alumni (87.5%, n=7) are employed in the state of Louisiana, while one (12.5%) is employed outside the state. Four (50.0%) are employed in higher education, one (12.5%) in government, one (12.5%) in a professional firm, one (12.5%) in business, and one (12.5%) in a nonprofit. Five (62.5%) respondents indicated their education was "Very Effective" in preparing them for employment or improving their job performance and three (37.5%) indicated it was "Effective". Three (37.5%) of the respondents are employed in the area of their Southeastern master's degree, four (50.0%) in a related area, and one (12.5%) in an unrelated area. One (12.5%) respondent indicated a salary range of \$30,001-\$40,000, two (25.0%) indicate \$40,001-\$50,000, three (37.5%) indicated \$50,001-\$60,000, one (12.5%) indicate \$60,001-\$70,000, and one (12.5%) greater than \$80,000.

Overall Satisfaction with Southeastern

In general, respondents were satisfied with Southeastern. Fifty percent (50.0%, n=4) had a Very Positive general attitude toward Southeastern, and an additional 37.5% (n=3) had a Positive general attitude toward Southeastern. One (12.5%) had a Neutral attitude. When asked if they would recommend Southeastern to a friend or family member considering graduate education,

62.5% (n=5) said they would with no reservation and 37.5% (n=3) indicated they would with some reservations.

The majority (75.0%, n=6) of the respondents indicated that if they were to do it again, they would elect to attend Southeastern for their Master's degree, one (12.5%) were not sure if they would, and one (12.5%) would not. Respondents were also asked if their college education had improved the quality of their life, regardless of the financial benefits. All (100.0%, n=8) of the respondents indicated that the quality of their life had not improved.
